

Taft College Alumnus Dante Scarnecchia Inducted into 2024 3C2A Hall of Fame

In Sacramento on March 27 at the Grand Sheraton, former Assistant Head Coach for the New England Patriots and Taft College Alumnus Dante Scarnecchia was one of six outstanding individuals inducted into the 2024 3C2A Hall of Fame. Dante Scarnecchia was a member of the 1966 Taft College Football Team that upset undefeated and national No. 1 seeded Boise Junior College to earn a bid to the Wool Bowl where Taft College beat Cisco College from Texas, 21-19. Scarnecchia was a part of the Patriots' Super Bowl wins in 2000, 2003, 2004, 2016, and 2018, as well as 10 conference championships. He is a member of the Patriots' Hall of Fame.
